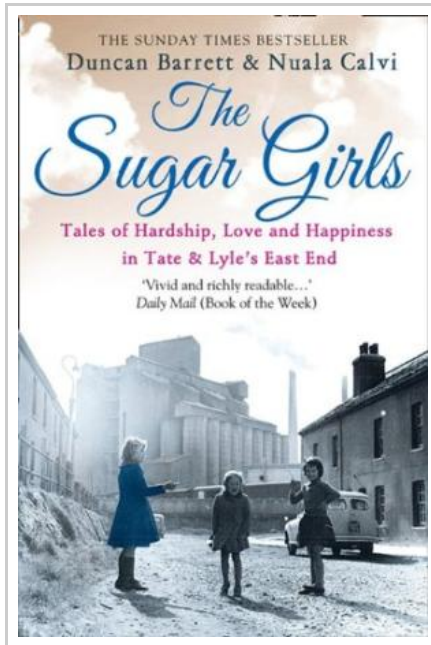




The Sugar Girls: Tales of Hardship, Love and Happiness in Tate Lyle s East End
