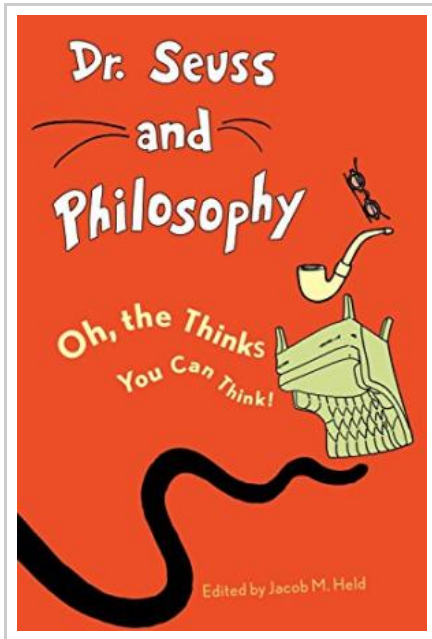




Dr. Seuss and Philosophy: Oh, the Thinks You Can Think!
